One Sabbath afternoon, while Rabbi Meir was in the House of Study, his two sons fell into a well and were drowned. Griefstricken, his wife Beruriah, carried them into her room and covered them. In the evening, when Rabbi Meir returned, he asked:

"Where are the children? I missed them at the House of Study."

Instead of replying, Beruriah handed him a goblet of wine for the recital of the Havdalah service.

After Rabbi Meir drank from the goblet, he again asked:

"Where are the children?"

"You will soon see them," said Beruriah, and placed the evening meal before him.

After he had said Grace, Beruriah turned to her husband: "I would like to ask you a question. Not long ago, some precious jewels were entrusted to my care. I became so attached to them that I regarded them as my own. Now, the owner has come to reclaim them. What shall I do?"

"I am surprised that you who know the Law ask such a question." Rabbi Meir said. "Naturally, the jewels belong to their owner and must be returned."

Beruriah then gently led her husband to the room and lifted the sheet from the bodies of their dead sons.

"My sons! My sons!" cried Rabbi Meir.

Tearfully, Beruriah reminded him:

A time for God, and a time for man. We turn to both in loyal love, and pledge ourselves to honor our heritage, to keep our covenant, to live our faith-walking with God, aspiring to perfection, laboring for a better life and a fruitful world, in a time of peace.

LIFE IS WORTH LITTLE UNLESS...

Lately, I have been thinking about what the goal of life should be. At best, man's life is short. His life may be kind or harsh, easy or difficult, but the time passes before he realizes it. An old person wants to live no less than a young person. The years of life do not satisfy the hunger for life. What then shall we do during this time?

We can reach either of two conclusions. The first is that since life is so short we should enjoy it as much as possible. The second is that precisely because life is short and no one can completely enjoy it (for we die with half our desires unsatisfied), therefore we should dedicate life to a sacred and worthy goal, to sacrifice it for something which will be valued above life. At times the first feeling is stronger and at others the second one. Of late, however, I think that the second feeling is dominant. It seems that I am slowly coming to the conclusion that life by itself is worth little unless it serves something greater than itself.

If I have offended *You*, *God*, I apologize and ask *Your* forgiveness. Please challenge me in the coming year with the challenge of feeling and accepting *Your* encouraging love. May *You* too have a good year and enjoy much joy from *Your* children.

IF I HAD TWO SOULS

Sometimes it takes twenty minutes, thirty minutes, even forty minutes to make the point you want to in a sermon, and sometimes you can make the point that you want to make in just a couple of sentences.

I ran across a sentence recently which is so simple, so healthy, so wise that I think it is a sermon in itself.

The sentence comes from Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach, the folk singer. Shlomo was born in Europe. He came here from Vienna as a teenager, because of the Nazis. Before he died he went back to Vienna and to several other cities in Austria and in Germany to give concerts. While there, he met with non-Jews as well as with Jews. Someone asked him why he did it. "Don't you hate them?" he was asked.

His answer was: "If I had two souls, I would devote one to hating them. But since I only have one, I don't want to waste it hating."

That is such a simple thought that I want to share it with you in these, the countdown days. We have one life, one soul, just one - we shouldn't waste it on hating: not the Nazis, most of whom are gone by now, not their children, who are not guilty of the sins of their fathers, and surely not the people around us.

Let this be the resolve for the new year: for the sake of our own mental health, let us hate less; let us love more.




